Each year, Sled Island's guest curator helps shape the tone of the festival through special programming and with their presence at the event. In addition to headlining at the #1 Royal Canadian Legion on Saturday, June 25, Sudan Archives has thoughtfully selected other exciting musicians, including:

Ahya Simone (Detroit, MI): A harpist and filmmaker whose music blends elements of R&B, classical and electronic music to fresh and exhilarating effect.

AllCityJimmy (Los Angeles, CA): The rapper formerly known as Nocando, whose recent work is a blend of lyrical ferocity and production that combines digital haze and punk rock.

Her work is based in the horrorcore, hip-hop and industrial metal genres, and includes a culmination of themes around the intersection between faith, identity, and queerness. The poetry of her lyrics are the beginning of a cathartic healing process in which she is granting herself permission to be angry.

Her album I LIE HERE BURIED WITH MY RINGS AND MY DRESSES features productions by Backxwash, clipping., Nowhere2Run, as well as features by Censored Dialogue, Lauren Bousfield, Sad13, and Ada Rook





ALEX CAMERON SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA Thu 11:30pm - Dickens

Alex Cameron's music can make you cringe and choke up in the same moment. A storuteller with a vivid imagination for relatable – if sometimes slimy - characters, Cameron got his start with 2013's Jumping the Shark. The collection of bleak bedroom pop saw him embody the persona of a failed, aging lounge singer to spin yarns that drew from dark real-life experiences.

The resulting attention netted him tours with Angel Olsen, Mac Demarco and Unknown Mortal Orchestra, a gig songwriting for The Killers and a partnership with Secretly Canadian that began with Jumping the Shark's re-release in 2016.

His second album Forced Witness announced Cameron's true arrival with a full band including his saxophonist and business partner Roy Molloy. It expanded his arsenal of characters to include an online creep contemplating the end, a wannabe Marlon Brando and an existentially romantic dude who just got "shat on by an eagle" - that last one is a duet alongside Olsen with a video starring Jemima Kirke, Cameron's collaborator and romantic partner going forward.

Cameron was originally slated, pre-pandemic, to appear at Sled Island in support of his third album Miami Memory, a synth-pop/dive-bar rock opus. The disc melds his ability to conjure blue imagery (analingus is compared to eating oysters) with moving ruminations on familial responsibility, finding true love and the dignity of sex work. A master of building characters with extreme specificity, his work feels true because he goes places that are graphic and eyebrow-raising, not in spite of it.

His latest release, Oxy Music, another rich tapestry of character embodiment, this time largely focusing on a man disillusioned in part due to the opioid crisis. Kirke again directs and stars in a clip for lead single "Best Life," a best-yet visual collaboration between the couple. Sled Island 2022 will be one of audiences' first chances to see these new songs on stage, brought to life by Cameron and his band.

BUILT TO SPILL BOISE, ID

Indie rock institution Built to Spill is back with its first album of original material in seven uears: When The Wind Forgets Your Name, out on Sub Pop this September. The record's lead single "Gonna Lose" has core band member Doug Martsch singing woozily about acid in a falsetto while his signature quitar heroics provide a hook with emotional stakes.

This will be the band's 10th studio album - counting the 2020 cover record Built to Spill Plays the Songs of Daniel Johnston - since forming in 1992. The word "band" is tricky here, as Built to Spill has always been Martch's vehicle, shaking up his lineup of players every few years since formation. In those early days, Built to Spill received acclaim for its unconventional song structures and extended run-times, capturing the attention of Warner Bros. following the release of now-classic There's Nothing Wrong with Love in 1994.


The Warner Bros. era – which is just



now ending with the announcement of When The Wind Forgets Your Name – saw the band prove that indie rock could go major without losing creative control or quality. Perfect From Now On (1997) and Keep it Like a Secret (1999), are considered two of the best and most influential albums of the '90s, respectively capturing the band's ability to make seven-plus-minute epics and quick, peppy bursts of

indie gold.

This will be Built to Spill's third appearance at Sled Island Following sets in 2010 and 2016. It's the first chance for Calaarians to see the current lineup of Martsch alongside Melanie Radford and Teresa Esquerra, as well as songs from When The Wind – an exciting new era for an act that's been at the top of its game for nearly 30 years.

Known best as the songwriter/lead performer behind Mint Records act Wares, Cassia Hardy will be performing as a solo act at Sled Island this year. Hardy is a fearsome performer whether with band or solo, and has a back catalogue of tunes ranging from quiet and acoustic to utterly rollicking. Hardy's most recent album as Wares, Survival, received a glowing review from PitchFork and was longlisted for the 2020 Polaris Prize.

CAT 500

LOS ANGELES, CA **SELECTED BY SUDAN ARCHIVES**

Sat 10:00pm - #1 Legion (Upstairs) Self-described as "a torrential downpour of psycho pop," Cat 500 makes experimental electronic music that somehow sounds both like the soundtrack to the early days of the internet, with glitchy, highly compressed, low bitrate thumps, and that of a future where genres have folded in on themselves, through layered, near alien-like vocals. It's a disorienting cacophony of otherwise familiar sounds that creates one hell of a trip through the unknown.

CAYLEM SIMEON

Sat 6:00pm - Broken City (Patio) Tsuut'ina Nation-resident Caylem Simeon has been a house and techno DJ for nearly 30 years and currently runs Drumbeat Entertainment as executive talent director. Locally,

he has held local residencies and performed at Beakerhead and the Alberta Electronic Music Conference, while abroad he has created mixes for Pure Radio Holland and Boss Traxx Radio in New York City.

CEDRIC NOEL

His nine studio albums (including last year's World's Most Stressed Out Gardener) have all received critical acclaim; he has been an anchor artist for local label Flemish Eye; he has contributed to music for acts like Women, Marlaena Moore and Alvvays; and he's an accomplished illustrator and animator. In addition to performing at Sled Island, VanGaalen will also mount a solo art show at nvrlnd. arts foundation in Ramsay during the festival.



Grouper's sound lingers on a purgatorial plane, roaming through a great beyond of folky acoustic drones and piano-driven requiems. There's a stillness in the tonality of the songs, but a great deal of movement in her lyricism.

Finding ever-growing acclaim from fans and critics alike, Grouper's album *Ruins* perhaps best exemplifies the tumultuous and sometimes eerie world Harris creates. Its encroaching swells give way to scattered piano keys with whispered lyrics fitting snugly in between each note.

Harris played Sled Island in 2018 in support of follow-up Grid of Points. with a new set of tales wrapped up in her delicate songcraft, before releasing a nearly wordless ambient electronic album under the name Nivhek in 2019. She returns to the festival this year with a new album in tow, 2021's Shade. Named Best New Music and the 18th best album of the year by Pitchfork, Shade delineates Grouper's sonic tendencies into two extremes: clean, spare tracks with minimal accompaniment and noiseriddled bursts of obfuscations. Harris has never sounded so much like herself.

Much like her albums, Grouper's live sets are intensely personal, aimed to evoke the deepest responses from both longtime fans and first-time witnesses. Performances often feature monochromatic projections to complement the ethereal atmosphere; they're a place to be introspective or simply just to sway.

production throughout, the Anarchy is a Comin' EP features razor-sharp hooks, jutting riffs and a rigorous rhythm section. Known for their funky instrumentals and wisecracking lyrics, Hairnet live sets are bold, brash and enthralling.

California good-time punks Joyce Manor are back with 40oz. to Fresno, the band's sixth album in a career spanning over a decade.

Formed in 2008 by lead vocalist-guitarist Barry Johnson and guitarist Chase Knobbe after a drunken visit to Disneyland, Joyce Manor's self-titled debut album came out in 2011 and was named *Punknews*' album of the year. A look back at the album on its 10-year anniversary from PitchFork called it "the first definitive punk album of the Tumblr era" and the band itself "a SoCal Guided By Voices that exclusively drank alcopops." With 10 songs that came in just under 19 minutes, the band explored crushes, getting drunk and feeling trapped in a small town - all staples of pop-punk - but with a distinct perspective, and with some songs that eschewed verse-chorus-verse structure.

Listeners across lines of pop-punk, emo and indie agreed – this was something special. From there the band would continue to receive acclaim, sell-out shows and release an album roughly every two years, each tooling with what can be done that's actually new in a genre with fairly strict restraints. Notably, third album Never Hungover Again marked the band's signing to the legendary Epitaph Records and an evolution of sorts in sound. It turned up the already potent hooks to 11, added keyboards but kept the band's signature malaise smouldering just below the surface.

Now, the band will play one of its first shows following the release of 40oz, to Fresno (released June 10) at Sled Island, just a year after the 10th-anniversary remaster of its debut. With an ample catalogue of fan favourites and a new set of songs that are doubtlessly a next exciting chapter, it's a damn fine time to be a Joyce Manor fan.

LA LUZ

GRASS VALLEY, CA

When La Luz burst onto the garage-rock scene in 2012 with debut album It's Alive, it was immediately clear their take on surfinspired, noir-leaning songs was here to stay. The band's snappy rhythm section, chunky organ melodies, guitar rave-ups and AM gold-harmonies felt fresh and vital even when among their similarly influenced peers.

La Luz toured endlessly in support of It's Alive and proved that those songs that crackled through reverb in the studio made for a hell of a party on stage. The invigorating grooves found on tracks like "Sure as Spring" and "Call Me in the Day" burned even brighter and hit even harder in the live setting.

Off this solid foundation the group sprung into the recording of 2015's Weirdo Shrine, a critical hit produced by Ty Segall in a converted surf shack. And while that record was heavily inspired by a science-fiction graphic novel about a supernatural STI, its recording aesthetic more accurately captured the rushes and crashes of seeing the band perform live. Another householdname producer entered the fray for Floating Features: Dan Auerbach of The Black Keys. Crisp and more melodic than ever, the album brought La Luz to new heights both artistically and in audience size.

Things weren't always roses along the way. The band miraculously survived a freak-accident bus crash in 2013 and founding member, vocalist and guitarist Shana Cleveland more recently announced that she had breast cancer. But now the band is back on the road in support of its excellent self-titled album from last year. With psych elements and dialed up folk-noir elements from Cleveland's solo career, it exemplifies an already-at-peak band refreshed and ready for its next exciting chapter.

Now two years on, JOYFULTALK returns to Calgary in support of its May 2022 release, Familiar Science.

National treasure Julie Doiron is a devastating and prolific singersongwriter with more than 20 albums released throughout her illustrious career, either under her own name, as Broken Girl, in collaboration with Mount Eerie, as a member of Eric's Trip and Shotgun & Jaybird, and beyond. Her 2021 album I Thought of You is her first in nine years and was recorded with established Canadian musicians Daniel Romano, lan Romano and Dany Placard.

JULIUS SUMNER MILLER CALGARY, AB

Wed 10:00pm - Ship & Anchor Classic punk five-piece Julius Sumner Miller has been active since 2013, releasing four full-length albums in the process. Fronted by Darren Ollinger, the band makes the kind of music that would be right at home on the '90s-era Warped Tour stage or in a DIY skate video. With this mix, personality is key, and the band has it — tracks like "Cheap Parmesan" show just how fun it is to join in on their sound.

K.BURWASH





MAHOGANY FROG

WINNIPEG. MB

A prolific psych band with 20 years of experience, Mahogany Frog returns to Sled Island on the heels of its seventh studio album (2021's Mahogany Frog In The Electric Universe) and an unofficial score for the 1926 German silent film Faust. Tinged with prog, krautrock and classic psych, the band veers groove-laden and propulsive, more juggernaut and anthemic than navel-gazing and hazy.



LOW DULUTH, MN

A lot of superlative adjectives get used when describing what it's like to listen to Low or attend one of the band's performances. Hypnotic, engrossing, transcendent, explosive – you get it. Except you don't, unless you've experienced it for yourself.

The band's career began with a three-album run for

Virgin's Vernon Yard imprint that included 1994 debut album I Could Live in Hope. At this time, core members Alan Sparhawk and Mimi Parker began receiving acclaim for the group's keen ear for dynamics and use of minimalism and harmonies to build an all-consuming sound on its own, subdued terms. (The press would call it "slowcore," though the band itself is no fan of the term.) Gently strummed guitars and a minimal drum kit were all the band needed to underscore Sparhawk and Parker's sublime vocals.

Evolutions in sound came gradually, somewhat coinciding with label jumps. The turn of the Millennium was spent at Kranky, where more ambient textures began to creep in, before the band found its (so-far) permanent home at Sub Pop in 2005. It was here that classic albums *The Great Destroyer* and *Drums and Guns* were made, works that showed the band could successfully update its sound with lush instrumentation, driving rock elements and electronic experiments.

Most recently, Low has received some of its best reviews to date for the bombed-out electronic dissonance on 2018's Double Negative and 2021's HEY WHAT — the latter of which was nominated for a 2021 Grammy. It's on the victory lap for these transformative works that Low makes its second Sled Island appearance this year, at perhaps the most exciting time to see the band in its history.



LYDIA LUNCH RETROVIRUS

NEW YORK, NY

Lydia Lunch may well have invented no wave when she erupted upon the downtown New York scene of the late '70s and fronted the revolutionary Teenage Jesus and the Jerks. Considered to be one of the defining movements of music's last half-century, no wave has been explored in the Brian Eno-curated New York No Wave compilation, countless articles, a book and by just about every discordant musician to exist since. For a great primer on


Lunch herself, check out the 2019 doc Lydia Lunch: The War is Never Over.

Throughout her career, Lunch has defied convention in many ways outside of music. Her singular voice has lent itself to film, poetry, spoken word, books, comics, podcasting and even self-empowerment. Her collaborators include Sonic Youth, Einstürzende Neubauten, Nels Cline, Hubert Selby Jr. and innumerable others.

Hostile, vulgar and unfiltered, Lunch's iconic swagger is something everyone wants but few could handle; partly why she never entered the mainstream system. Her company Widowspeak Productions handles all her recording and publishing, including the career-hopping live album *Retrovirus* (2013) — also the name of her current performance vehicle.

Made up of Lunch and "all-star cast of sonic brutarians" Weasel Walter, Kevin Shea and Tim Dahl, Lydia Lunch RETROVIRUS will tackle Lunch's works from 1977 to present via selections from previous bands like Teenage Jesus and the Jerks and 8 Eyed Spy, or classic albums Queen of Siam and Shotgun Wedding, wading into territories of no wave, hard rock, psychedelia, "illustrated word" and "jazz noir" in the process.

This blueprint aside, the work of Lydia Lunch is predictable to no one. You will be frightened, perplexed and engrossed by what you see. If you're open enough, you will also be tremendously inspired.



OMBIIGIZI

Expect a palpable energy and new songs as the band gears up for its forthcoming album Enny One Wil Love You.

PRIMITIVE MAN

DEOVER CO

If you're looking for a doom metal band that's all in on sonic extremes, you've found it. Trio Primitive Man has released three albums since its formation in 2012 and is commonly called one of the most brutal and nihilist bands in metal. Latest release, 2020's *Immersion*, saw the group at its tightest focus and most precisely weaponized yet.

PUPPET WIPES

Local punks Arielle McCuaig and Kayla MacNeill's new project puppet wipes is a "celebration of musical amateurism, lyrical experimentation and the wonder of performance." PRINCESS NOKIA NEW YORK, NY Fri 10:00pm - Palace Theatre

If you want proof of Princess Nokia's firepower behind the mic across diverse stules, look no further than the 2020 dual albums Everything Sucks and Everything is Beautiful.

Everything is Beautiful, held together by a bedrock of lush, soulful instrumentation, shows Nokia's more vulnerable side across 12 Feel-good tracks.

Sucks, on the other hand, is a tough-as-nails combination of minimal trap beats, growls and boasts. Standout single "I Like Him," surpassed even her 2017 breakout hit "Tomboy," receiving Gold certification from the RIAA and becoming inescapable on TikTok. (We still have "my little titties and my phat belly" stuck in our heads pretty much 24/7, though.) Elsewhere, "Harley Quinn" and "Welcome to the Circus" are twisted odes to chaos with just a pinch of winking juggalo spice tossed in for good measure.

Although both records have distinct, well-defined aesthetics. Nokia talks about how she brings together disparate influences for something distinctly her own on both. A chameleon since day one, the Afro-Indigenous artist traces her heritage to Puerto Rico and has lived in nearly every corner of New York, where she has founded the crews House of Mongo and Brujas. She has tackled goth, skater, ballroom, emo and other influences across

Remarkably, none of her projects feel like a detour off course. Rather, each reveals and explores a layer of her artistry, as her stage show proves. Her energetic, commanding performances unify the material in a way that needs to be experienced to be believed.

organizer with The House of Malico, a "creative hub offering contemporary art, production services and public programs." Following her stellar 2018 EP Flavor of Green, Queens D. Light has more recently released singles like "1111" and the addictive "Make it Shake," alongside Turkana and Suzi Analogue.

R.A.P. FERREIRA

Thu 12:30am - Broken City (Main Floor) Formerly known as milo, R.A.P. Ferreira is a loquacious rhymer whose verbosity is complemented by jazz-infused productions. Originally from the American Midwest, Ferreira has lived around the country and operates his own label / record shop, RBYT, dedicated to underground rap. A busy bee during the pandemic, he has released three full-lengths since 2020, each receiving critical acclaim for his outside-the-box style and authenticity.

RA / SOL

VANCOUVER, BC

You may have seen Aurora Sol (a.k.a. ra / sol) as half of the DJ duo Pyramid Schema opening for Le1f back in 2019. But as a solo artist, ra / sol makes genre-defying music that blends electronic wizardry with live guitar.

While sonically hard to describe, their music takes inspiration from queer liberation and the roots of dance music culture.

THE RADIATION FLOWERS SASKATOON, SK

Fri 9:30pm - Broken City (Main Floor) The Radiation Flowers make psych that lies somewhere between shoegaze and space rock without feeling stuck in either genre. Most recent release Stuck In A Maze layers ethereal vocals, organ and guitar into a throbbing hum that fits from melodic to droning on a dime. Meanwhile, locked grooves create a trance-like effect that lures listeners onto the band's nuclear but pastoral level.

RAEBURN SASKATOON, SK

From loosey-goosey folk-rock tunes to psychedelic epics, Saskatoon's Raeburn is a multi-talented band that seemingly enjoys exploring genre through the power of groove. Start with Bongo Dracula from 2019 (Grey Records) for a primer, and look forward to a new album due out at some point this year.

REMPEL & THE ROUSERS VANCOUVER, BC

Fronted by "local hair legend" Rempel Roquette and rounded out by Chance Lovett (Chantrells/Solo), Mike Flintoff (Tranzmitors), Mattlan Wickens (The Mandates) and Michael McDiarmid (Ballantynes), Rempel & The Rousers channel '70s icons from glam, soul and straight-up rock 'n' roll. Roquette's looming presence and spun-outtacontrol guitars make for a blitz of fun that feels classic while still fresh.

THE RIFLE COUNTY PLAYERS CALGARY, AB

What started out as something of a joke between punks has become one of the must-see country-rock acts in Calgary. The Rifle County Players is made up of members of Sunglaciers, Window Lamp and Paradise, but channels an Old West outlaw aesthetic for the project at hand. The dust storm found on six-song EP Dead to You will give you a good sense of what to expect.

RIP ROOM

SAN FRANCISCO, CA

Thu 5:00pm - Sloth Records Sat 11:00pm - Ship & Anchor

San Francisco's Rip Room successfully combine the abandon of garage punk with the neurosis of post-punk with greater success than most bands do.

Those angular jitters and shout-spokensung vocals are there, but furiously upbeat drums and a certain looseness around the edges keep things from getting too grim. New album Alight and Resound arrives just before Sled Island. making it a perfect time to get a taste.

ROB KNAGGS WINNIPEG, MB

Fans of folk tunes and evocative movie scores will take to the experimental stylings of cellist Rob Knaggs. 



Though the word "mythology" connotes a bygone era of dusty legends and pagan zealotry, powerful myths are still being made right now, today. Sudan Archives (mortal name: Brittney Parks) and her visionary debut album Athena are living proof.

Parks is a self-taught violinist and vocalist who belts from the depths of her being, breathes out sound with ragged elegance and on standout track "Icelandic Moss" uses words to make the texture of moss in Iceland an analog for just how little people understand her. Her violin playing, block-rattling low-end and precise command of electronic slipstreams build the world where this makes perfect sense.

In response to her first self-produced two EPs – Sudan Archives (2017) and Sink (2018) – she was labelled a mix of electro-folk and R&B. These words aren't exactly wrong, but they're more effective in describing themes within Sudan Archives than they are at containing her. The electro-folk part is shorthand for the way her music lives across eras of sound, while the R&B influence describes the way her tremendous voice disobeys structural convention to jaw-snatching effect. What Sudan Archives is, quite simply, is a contemporary musician with a clarity of voice rendered with a natural intuition for the sound textures from her life that are the most true.



Originally selected for Sled Island 2020 ahead of its cancellation, she has curated – perhaps unconsciously – pieces of a life spent in church choirs, at fiddle club, digging up her musical ancestry and at electronic-scene fringes into a context wholly new. There's a spritz of Postera Björk volatility here, a tinge of Stones Throw Recordsforebear J Dilla texture there, but Sudan Archives is best summed up by her ability to do what a curator does best: create an entirely new story in the places in between where no one else has explored. It's for this reason that we are most excited to welcome her as the guest curator for Sled Island 2022.



So that happened, and when I wasn't able to shop for records anymore because everything was closed, I found out just how much of a vinyl junkie I had become. In reaction I did what any normal human would do and bought a collection of 2500 extremely random albums — loaded my station wagon to the roof with them — and turned my basement into a lockdown-friendly crate dig, which kept the monkey fed for a while. And then I did it again.

One thing led to another as they sometimes will, and a year later I found myself opening up an honest-to-god record store on the second floor of a very cool new vintage market.

One of our founding principles was inclusivity: as much of a music snob as I had been in my younger days, I'd still find myself second-guessing my record purchases based on whether the cashier would think they were cool enough. And I wound up buying a lot of dumb records because they were hipper than the ones I really wanted.

So none of that here. You know what's cool? What makes you happy. Whether it's 80s Euro-disco or avant-garde electronica, snotty punk or corny country, opera or operetta, top 40 pop or moustache rock, Maritime fiddle music or hard bop, or [name your summer jam], it's all good.

We've got an ever-evolving selection of local and indie gems on tape and CD too - as well as music-related DVDs & books; magazines; a bottomless well of 45s; carrying cases & accessories; and a smattering of vintage hi-fi equipment.



We clean every album in an ultrasonic bath, tidy up the jacket if needed, nestle it in a protective polyethylene sleeve, and set a price that should let you take a chance on a joint you haven't heard yet - or maybe even heard of.

From wherever you are in the city we're an easy bike, bus, or car trip. Budget some time to spend, because another of our founding principles is the joy of the dig, the thrill of discovery, the element of surprise. Find us tucked away on a side street, head up the big curved staircase, and roll up your sleeves to dive into the stacks for your next hit. See you at the Sudan Archives show, yeah?

GREEN ISLAND

Sled Island is dedicated to operating an environmentally responsible festival. ■ 17th Avenue

17th Avenue SW is a vibrant hub that is home to some of Calgary's best boutiques, restaurants, and bars; the most populated area running from 14th St SW to Centre St S. Venues on 17th

Avenue include Pin-Bar, Sloth Records and The Ship & Anchor.

Beltline

North of 17th Avenue and west of Victoria Park. Calaaru's Beltline runs north to south from 10 Ave Sw to 17 Ave SW, and east to west from 1 St SW to 14 St SW. Venues in the Beltline include Broken City, and Commonwealth.

Downtown Core

The Downtown Core (also known as "The Core") is where most of Calgary's office towers are located, as well as the central C-Train lines. The Downtown Core runs north to south from 1 Ave Sw to 9 Ave SW and east to west from 7 St SE to 14 St SW and also encompasses the East Village and Eau Claire areas. Venues in the Downtown Core include The #1 Legion, Central United Church, Dickens, Globe Cinema, The Palace, and The Palomino.

Inglewood/Ramsav

Just east of the Downtown area, Inglewood primarily runs along 9 Ave SE from

8 St SE to 19 St SE. Inglewood is home to many restaurants, antique stores, breweries, and boutiques, and it is located next to Ramsay where you'll find the Dandy Tasting Room, Nyrnld. Boutique and this year's Block Party

Kensington

North of the Bow River, the Kensington/ Hillhurst area runs north to south from Memorial Dr. NW to 8 Ave NW. and east to west from 10 St NW to 14 St NW. A laid-back neighborhood full of cafes, shops, pubs, and restaurants, Kensington is easily accessible via the red C-Train line (Sunnyside Station)

■ Mission

South of 17th Avenue, Mission is a trendy neighborhood that runs along 4th Street SW, starting at 17 Ave SW, ending at Elbow Dr. SW. Expect to find some of the city's best restaurants, cafes, and shops.

■ Victoria Park

East of the Beltline and North of 17th Avenue, Victoria Park runs north to



south from 17 Ave SW to 10 Ave SW. and east to west from 7 St SE to 2 St SW. A go-to spot for delicious meals and inventive cocktails. Venues in Victoria Park include Kaffeeklatsch. Shuffleclub, and The Tea House.

Other

Other neighborhoods that are a short drive from central Calgary are Bridgeland (Boogies Burgers, Lukes Drug Mart, MOVE), Marda Loop (Boogies Burgers, Phil & Sebastian, The Nines), Killarney (Lukes Drug Mart), and Ramsay (Rosso Coffee Roasters, The Compound). Slightly further, we have Chinook/Manchester Industrial Area (Phil & Sebastian, Pizza Face).


